## First Grade News

I am so very proud of the progress the children have made this year. They have come such a long way with their **reading, writing and math** skills. # **Fourth Grade News**



#### Fifth Grade News



# Middle School Literature & Creative Writing

Middle School English Language Arts is working diligently during the last few weeks of the school year . The 6th grade finished reading the novel "Messenger, the third in "The Giver" series and has begun the final book in the series "Son." They are enjoying seeing connections between the books and are starting to piece together answers to their initial question: "What happened to Jonah and Gabe?" Their final exam will be a project connecting all the books in the series. The 7th grade is reading a fantasy book from the Percy Jackson series; "Percy Jackson and the Sea Monster," and have an accompanying packet to go along with the reading. The 8th grade has turned in their book reports, and their Research Projects are due next week. After they submit the project, they will present their projects to the class, two students per day, until their graduation. Thank you everyone for your attendance and support for "The Lion King!" # Middle School Spanish

Students can earn 5 points toward their exam by showing a signed STUDY GUIDE.

**GRADE 6:** The exam will be on conjugating of verbs ending in 'ar' and the conjugating of the verb 'ir'

**GRADE 7:** The exam will be on the conjugating of verbs ending in 'ar' and 'er'. There will be 20 sentences.

**GRADE 8**: The exam will be on the conjugating of verbs ending in 'ar' and 'er'. There will be 20 sentences.

# Middle School Religion

Students can earn 10 points toward their exams by showing a signed STUDY GUIDE and by handing in the on-line test.

**GRADE 6:** The exam is on chapter 23.

**GRADE 7:** The exam is on chapter 20.

**GRADE 8:** The exam is on chapter 21.

# Middle School Skills

<u>Grade 6 Skills</u>: Students are finishing Unit 14 & Unit 15 in the Sadlier workbook. Students have already started Unit 14 and will be finishing up both units before the end of the school year.

<u>Grade 7 Skills:</u> Students have finished the Sadlier workbook. Students will be working on reading texts & learning how to find important information within the text.

<u>Grade 8 Skills</u>: Students will be having a test on Unit 15, which concluded the Sadlier workbook. Students will be working on a career path packet that will count as their final exam.

## Middle School Mathematics

**Grade 8** will continue to take exams. In addition, we will be continuing to study key concepts needed for high school.

Grade 7: Students will take their math exam on Monday, June 4<sup>th</sup>. They have been working on study guide problems in class and for homework. Students will then continue to study essential concepts for 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Students are expected to work on Khan Academy during the summer. Every student has a school login and password.

## Middle School Social Studies



## Middle School Science

**Grade 6:** The students have been working on their 3D projects; Volcanoes! They had an opportunity to have them "erupt" in front of an audience! Their enthusiasm about Earth Science exceeded my expectations!
